The 360 Program offers one-on-one support for students' academic transition, financial planning, social engagement and wellness during their time at the U of A. Programming includes placement in a 360 UNIV 10051 section and an assigned 360 advisor & peer mentor.

ASAP celebrates and supports the academic achievement of first-generation Arkansas students at the University of Arkansas. Programming includes a summer bridge program, academic, financial, and career guidance, mentoring, and more!

MAJOR EXPLORATION

Exploration Coaches help students make sense of the major selection process. Our coaches offer holistic major exploration support in one centralized location, so students don't have to visit multiple offices to get the guidance they need.

Exploration coaches can help students:

- explore resources to clarify their decision to change their major;
- select a major based on their interests, skills, and career aspirations;
- understand key major change processes; and
- connect with people who will assist them with changing their major.

FINANCIAL EMPOWERMENT

Financial Empowerment Coaches work with students to create strategies for navigating the financial aspects of college and understanding how academic choices can affect the total cost of attendance.

We will work with students in three key areas:

- understanding how to fund their education and future goals;
- navigating their current financial environment;
- and exploring financial strategies to pay for college.
