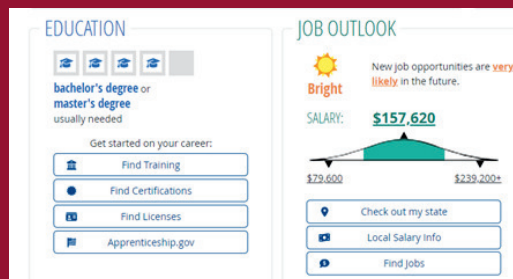
YOUR ENROLLMENT CHECK-LIST

Many students will get to their enrollment date and hit a snag, causing them to delay securing their spot in the classes they need. Here is a list of things you can do to help you get through enrollment:

- **Know your registration date.** This date can be found in an email from the Registrars office.
- **Meet with your advisor.** Your advisor can remove advising holds and help you determine what classes you should take this coming semester. Here are some good questions to ask in those meetings:
 - What are the most important classes for me to take to stay on my current graduation timeline?
 - Are there classes in my shopping cart I should prioritize and build the rest of my schedule around?
 - Do any of the classes in my shopping cart fill up fast? What are good back up classes to take?
- **Need help adding classes?** Stop by the CORD Welcome Desk and ask for help adding classes to your shopping cart.

WHAT COMES NEXT?

So, you had an appointment with your advisor and planned for spring classes. What can you do next? This is a great time to think about what you can do with your major! In a major exploration appointment, we can look at the kinds of careers that are out there for your major. We can look at predicted salaries as well as job opportunities in the state where you want to live.



Making an appointment with a coach is a great way to stay on track with your plans, especially when you are fresh from an advising session. As you gear up for the last weeks heading into finals, you can think about how you want to use what you are learning. Talk to a major exploration coach and get ready for what happens next!

ENROLLMENT AND FINANCES

Does your scholarship have credit hour requirements? Many University of Arkansas scholarships require students to complete a minimum of 30 credit hours combined during fall, spring, and summer terms. Just the same, standard GPA minimums are 2.5 or 2.75. With that said, certain scholarships can have different criteria than those listed above.
